OUR HISTORY

SAVE A GIRL SAVE A WORLD (SAGSAW), is a multigenerational mentoring non-profit organization with a rich history rooted in the collaborative vision of women of color. Its inception can be traced back to a pivotal conversation that took place during the RPC Annual Conference, where the economist, Dr. Julianne Malveaux, inspired the name. The concept gained traction when Glenda A. Gill, the organization's founder, brought it to life, supported by the initial financial backing from the Ford Motor Company and a group of supportive sisters, Pam Alexander, Barbara Perkins, and Lavonia Perryman.

Established initially as a 3-day retreat focused on our 4-pillars hosted at Bennett College - Greensboro, NC. SAGSAW has significantly evolved as the need became greater than the serving. The organization has grown into a fully-fledged institution and is currently situated at Clark Atlanta University and extended its reach of serving students at six historically black colleges and universities

Her passion is fueled by her own time served in federal prison for over a decade. During this time, Angela, who was a former educator and graduate of Clark Atlanta University, found herself on a journey where freedom was first found behind bars. It was during her time incarcerated that she began the process of transformation into a better version of herself. It was this person who ultimately found an indomitable spirit that

understood the impact of decisions and inequities that are laden in a fragmented judicial system when poor decisions are made, and women are a growing number in the criminal industrial complex that destroys families and reduces the economic outcomes of those children and families left behind. While many would have wanted to give up, Angela turned her tragedy into triumph and is now using her experience to help others. The founder of "Chance 2 Change", a nonprofit in Atlanta, she works with other nonprofits who have an aligned mission to reduce incarceration and improve criminal thinking and addiction among marginalized groups. Currently she works as a Credible Messengers through the Offender Alumni Association, Project Regress, and Freedom is a Choice. As a living testimony on choices and a chance to have hope despite circumstances, Angela is the ultimate case study for what is possible.

She aims to be the voice of the voiceless, hope for the heartless and faith for the fearful with an unflinching desire to continue her work until there is more education in America and less incarceration. Angela is a mother, a grandmother, and a daughter and the greatest of these is she is the better version of the person she used to be.

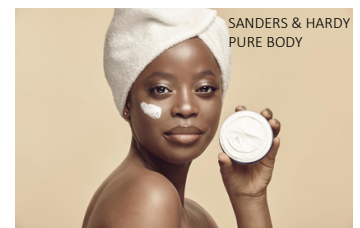
